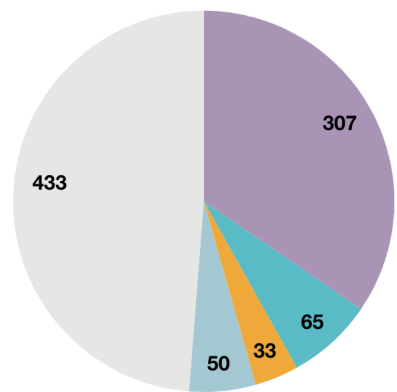

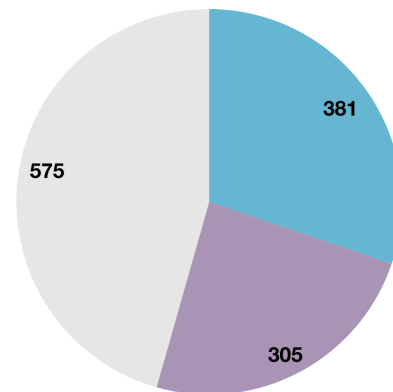

UCLA is Advancing the Field

UCLA faculty are key to building the field through research related to ACEs, toxic stress, and trauma-informed care

Innovation

The Innovation Lab

Goals:

- Systematic evaluation of the progress and impact of ACEs Aware activities in Los Angeles Department of Health Services' (LA DHS) large, real-world setting.
- Cross-sector partnerships across medicine, neuro-science, public health, and public policy to advance prevention and treatment of toxic stress

Evaluating Impact: The Innovation Lab

Early findings:

- More referrals after screening
 - Improved California Quality Improvement Program (QIP) metrics
 - Preventive health visits
 - Vaccination
- Expanded access to Medi-Cal programs
 - Non-specialty mental health services
 - CalAIM's Enhanced Care Management
 - Community Health Worker benefit



Academic Pilot Projects

Goal

- To advance clinical practice, education and training in ACE screening, toxic stress treatment, and the prevention and treatment of ACE-Associated Health Conditions

Campuses:

- UCLA and UCSF
